**St Mary of the Angels PSR newsletter excerpt:** Joe Bertsch had the awesome opportunity to go to Jefferson City to witness the Ordination of Most Reverend W. Shawn McKnight. I had never been to an ordination and had no idea what to expect. I have to say, it was an amazing celebration and am glad I was able to attend. Each Bishop has their own Coat of Arms. The motto chosen by Bishop McKnight is “Gratias Agamus Domino” which means “Let us give thanks to the Lord our God”. On the right side of the shield (the viewers left) is the Coat of Arms of the Diocese of Jefferson City. It has a red Phrygian Cap which is a symbol of Liberty. At the top in the middle is the cross of Christ and on the left is a crescent representing the Immaculate Heart of Mary. The right crescent symbolizes the Missouri River. The opposite side of the shield is red to symbolize the personal devotion of Bishop McKnight to the Sacred Heart of Jesus as well as the Immaculate heart of Mary, the patron of our Diocese. There is also a quail which is a symbol of God’s providential blessing and also because Bishop McKnight likes to hunt quail in which he experiences the beauty, harmony, and providence of God in nature.

**Bishop Shawn McKnight** announced the following appointments to his executive cabinet:

**Monsignor Robert A. Kurwicki**, pastor of Cathedral of St. Joseph parish, has been appointed vicar general of the diocese. **Father Mark Porterfield**, pastor of St. Brendan parish in Mexico, will serve as vice-chancellor, retaining his duties as judicial vicar in charge of the Tribunal and serving as chief canonist for the diocese, advising staff at the diocesan and parish levels on canon law matters.

**Sister Kathleen Wegman SSND**, will continue in her role as chancellor, overseeing human resources, youth protection services, and serving as delegate to religious communities, liaison to Catholic Charities and consultant to the parishes in leadership development for parish and finance advisory councils. **Father Gregory Meystrik**, pastor of St. Francis Xavier parish in Taos, has been appointed moderator of the curia, which previously was a duty joined with the office of vicar general. He will continue his prior duties overseeing administration for the diocese and act in the capacity of chief operating officer for the chancery. **Fr. Joseph Corel**, pastor of St. Andrew parish in Holts Summit, has been named vicar for prison ministry, which includes the pastoral care of those in jails and their families. In addition he will serve as a special assistant to the bishop until June, helping the bishop during this transitional period.

**St. Mary of the Angels Decorating Committee** met Friday, February 9th at 7 pm in Church. Members present were Connie Meissen, Cheri Vanderpool, Donald Meissen, Joe Bertsch, Mary Jo Vanderpool, Sue Noll, and Fr. Mike. Also present were Steve and M'liss Sanders, and Sarah Moore with Sanders Decorating and Design and Paul Kemner with A. H. Kemner and Sons. The bid for plaster repair and painting has been approved by the Diocese and a contract has been signed. The contract states that work will begin in the fourth quarter, but it is too soon for an exact start date. Sanders brought up paint and carpet samples. The committee picked neutral wall colors and have narrowed the carpet colors to two that will compliment the wall colors. M'liss and Sarah will be putting some accent colors together so the committee can choose from. They are interior designers and will be helping us put the color scheme together. The goal of the committee is to have colors that will compliment the altars and architectural features of the church. It will be painted similar to how it is currently, but using different colors. We are looking at storing the pews on the West end of the Hall while the work is being completed. The other option was to rent shipping containers. We discussed this with Paul Kemner and he said it would be better for the pews to be stored in the hall. He said when moving the pews, they are weak in the middle. Steve Sanders described the best and safest way to move the pews and Mr. Kemner agreed. We will be meeting again March 17th.
