Ask and You Shall Receive from St. Joseph Sunday Missal: Parents often display a remarkable patience in smilingly listening to the talk of their little children. And the little ones not only ask questions, they also ask for favors. Parents listen, but do they always grant what the little ones ask? Of course not! The horizons of children are limited. Often they ask for favors that would hurt them. Prudent parents show their real love by never giving children more freedom or favors that they are able to handle at any moment in life. However, whether one is a teenager or an adult, it takes humility to admit that one's horizon is limited. Yet when we think of the infinite wisdom and love of the heavenly Father, in faith we should be able to admit that he know better whatever is best for us. It is in this contest that we should see our prayer of petition. Does it make sense to pray for a beloved one who has terminal cancer? Should we pray in a seemingly hopeless marriage situation? Today's First Reading and Gospel teach us to pray with perseverance but also after some insights on what to expect from our prayer of petition.

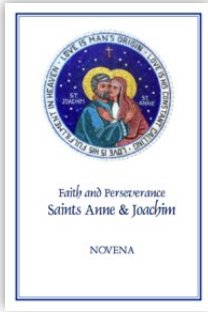

Quincy University announces the establishment of the **Father Philip "Phil" Moriarty Scholarship**. This scholarship was established in 2022 in memory of Fr. Philip "Phil" Moriarty by friends who admired him. He was ordained to the Holy Priesthood on May 17, 1980.

After serving as Assistant Pastor of Our Lady of Lourdes Church in Columbia, he was appointed Pastor of St. John Church, Memphis, MO and the Schuyler Catholic Community in Lancaster in 1984. He was appointed pastor of St Mary of the Angels Church, Wein, MO and Immaculate Conception Mass Station in Hamden in 1990, serving until his death in 2009. He also held the position of Senator of the Brookfield Deanery from May 1998 to October 2001. He celebrated his Silver Jubilee of Ordination on May 29, 2005. Fr. Phil was an inspiration to all who met him in his short 60 years with us on earth.

It will be awarded annually to a catholic student from northeast Missouri, with preference given to a member of St. Mary parish in Wien, MO or St. John parish in Memphis, MO, the two parishes where he served as pastor.

Totus Tuus was off to a great start and everyone who was attending was enjoying it. Monday evening, one of the team

members tested positive for Corona Virus, so the Diocese shut the program down the rest of the week. There were many sad kids. We will get the program free next year and we are supposed to have our pick of weeks as well. I will be contacting those parents who have been sending their children each year to see which week will work best when we have to register for next year in the fall.

Fr. Dandi Bermejo (former priest at Macon, Shelbina & Clarence) has been having heart issues for a while now and has been on medication. The doctors are doing some tests and blood work this week. He is going to travel to Iloilo City, which is on a neighboring island, for an angiogram.

January 26, 2022....Dear Mary, Susie, and all the beautiful staff of Share N' Care: Belated Merry Christmas and a Happy New Year! I am so sorry that my Christmas and New Year greetings are late as I got so overwhelmed with the load of the work before Christmas and New Year and until now actually I am still overwhelmed. We were hit very hard by the super typhoon RAI (local name is Odette) last December 16 which caused so much devastation and loss of lives, property, and homes of thousands of people. The estimated number of deaths is around 410 and 80 people are still missing. Typhoon RAI was so powerful and catastrophic that it brought torrential rains with packing winds up to 168 miles per hour. It pummeled us for nearly 10 long hours from 9 pm of December 16 up to 7 am in the morning of December 17. It was so scary. In its aftermath, we did not have electricity, water, and internet services for more than a week. (until now our internet service is not steady yet, it is on and off). So many areas have no power and water yet. We were busy the past three weeks trying to give relief assistance to the poor victims (providing as much as possible the basic needs like rice, food, water). We also shared monetary contributions to so many in order to help them even a little bit repair their devastated houses as well as providing medical assistance/medicines to those who were sick and helped bring some people to the nearest hospital and likewise helped them as much as we can to pay their hospital bills. It was so heartbreaking and until now-it is still. I sent you some pictures, Mary, Susie and staff, of some houses which were destroyed due to felled trees caused by the super typhoon RAI. As soon as the super typhoon RAI left the Philippines, we bought several sacks of rice and repacked them and distributed them to so many affected people most especially to the three communities, namely: Relocation Site, Zone 1, and then Zone 2. These three communities are so near our St. Joseph Charity Clinic and Works of Mercy Center. In the afternoon of December 25, we also bought around 70 pcs. of galvanized iron and gave them to around 10 families whose roofs of their houses were ripped off by "RAI". This is something very urgent as rain continues to pour here...so that they and their children will be protected from rain especially at night when they sleep. To date, we still continue giving rice/food/health assistance, and other relief assistance to so many other victims of the super typhoon RAI. It gives them so much hope and comfort. Needless to say, we really experienced a bleak Christmas and New Year here. It was so hard to say to people here, especially around three weeks ago- "Merry Christmas and a Happy New Year" in the midst of destruction and suffering. But what I continue sharing with them (and I don't care whether they believe me or not) is the message that Christ was the Emmanuel who was born to live and dwell with us. And because He dwells with us, there is HOPE. Because He dwells/lives with us, no matter how bad the situations we are in right now, everything will be OK, and something good will emerge from all these. Because He lives with us, like Him our lives at the end will have a HAPPY ENDING, and we will not end up being victims but VICTORS, not just survivors but CONQUERORS. And that is why His message and gift to us every Christmas and New Year is THE GIFT OF HOPE. On behalf of the people of Manapla, Philippines- we thank you again, Mary, Susie, and the beautiful people of Share N' Care at Wien, for all your loving help and support for us here. Don't be compelled though every time. But we really/deeply appreciate and are forever grateful for all your acts of love, kindness, and generosity to us here on the other side of the world. Likewise thank you too for all your prayers. O we need them all the time. Like Jesus, you give us so much JOY and HOPE. Be assured always of our prayers for you too. You are truly A BLESSING to me and the poor people here in Manapla, Philippines. GOD WILL BE YOUR REWARD. I miss you and your beautiful community and Church. God loves you, Mary, Susie, and all the Share N' Care Staff. Once more- A GRACE-FILLED AND A HAPPY NEW YEAR YEAR 2022 TO YOU FILLED WITH SO MUCH HOPE. GOD BLESS. Sincerely, Fr.
