Afra Christine Weimer, 72, Salisbury, died Saturday at Regional Hospital, Columbia after a lengthy illness.

She was born, August 21, 1912, to Otto and Louise (Steffes) Fessler. She was the oldest in a family of four children. She had worked in Kansas City for several years.

In 1936, she married Anton "Tony" Weimer at St Mary's Catholic Church, Wien. They made their home on a farm in rural Bynumbille, until his death in 1972. She remained on the farm until 1983, when she moved to the Senior Housing Unit in Salisbury, Mo.

Mrs Weimer was a member of the Catholic Church, sang in the church choir and was substitute church organist for many years.

Survivors include a daughter, Jeanett Rotert, Montrose, three sons, Leroy Weimer and Marion Weimer of Salisbury, and Wesley Weimer, Bynumville; one sister, Leona Clark, Wien, two brothers, Leonard Fessler, Salisbury, and Richard Fessler, Bynumville; seven grandchildren, one great grandchild, nieces, nephews and other relatives. Visitation was held and the Rosary was said Sunday evening at the Berry Funeral Home, Salisbury, with Fr Pat Pierceall and Fr. Clarence Weiderhodt officiating.
